Generative phonology is a branch of generative linguistics that determines the underlying set of rules governing the pronunciation of words in a person's native language. In general, generative linguistics refers to the theory that all human language is generated from linguistic structures that are hard-wired into the brain at birth. As a person acquires his or her native language, the structures that apply to that particular language are activated.

In linguistics, generative grammar is grammar (the set of language rules) that indicates the structure and interpretation of sentences that native speakers of a language accept as belonging to their language. Adopting the term generative from mathematics, linguist Noam Chomsky introduced the concept of generative grammar in the 1950s.

In 1968 Noam Chomsky and Morris Halle published The Sound Pattern of English (SPE), the basis for generative phonology. In this view, phonological representations are sequences of segments made up of distinctive features. These features were an expansion of earlier work by Roman Jakobson, Gunnar Fant, and Morris Halle. The features describe aspects of articulation and perception, are from a universally fixed set, and have the binary values + or 0.
