Independent Clause and Dependent Clause | Types Of Sentences

A dependent clause is a group of words that contains a subject and a verb. A dependent clause cannot be a sentence. They do not express complete thoughts, and thus cannot function as sentences. They are usually marked by dependant marker words. It is a word that is added to the beginning of an independent clause that makes it into a dependent clause.

Independent and Dependent Clauses | Definition, Usage ...

Independent clauses have three components: They have a subject - they tell the reader what the sentence is about. They have an action or predicate - they tell the reader what the subject is doing. They express a complete thought - something happened or was said.

A compound sentence contains two independent clauses joined by a conjunction. A complex sentence, on the other hand, contains an independent clause and a dependent clause. The latter is always dependent on the former to make a sentence meaningful. A clause is a collection of words and is a part of a complete sentence.

Difference Between Independent and Dependent Clause With ...

When you have a group of words that form their own sentence, all by themselves, we call this an independent clause. That means that, first and foremost, it is a complete thought and that it has both a subject and a verb. If it lacks a complete thought, but still has a subject and a verb we call it a dependent clause.

The Link between a Dependent Clause and an Independent Clause When a dependent clause is used as an adjective or an adverb, it will usually be part of a complex sentence (i.e., a sentence with an independent clause and at least one dependent clause). The link between a dependent clause and an independent clause will often be a subordinating conjunction or a relative pronoun. For example:

An adjective clause is a dependent clause that describes a noun in another part of a sentence. Usually, an adjective clause is very close to the noun it describes. Adjective clauses begin with the relative pronouns who, whom, whose, that, or which. They can also begin with the relative adverbs when, where, or why.

How to Identify Independent and Dependent Clauses

An independent clause is a clause that can stand alone as a sentence (i.e., it expresses a complete thought). A dependent clauses (or subordinate clause) is one that cannot stand alone as a complete sentence (i.e., it does not express a complete thought). Remember that a clause has a subject and a verb.
